

441 IAC 82.2(6) (Department of Human Services): Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded

82.2(6) Health care services.

a. Physician services.

(1) The facility shall ensure the availability of physician services 24 hours a day.

(2) The physician shall develop, in coordination with licensed nursing personnel, a medical care plan of treatment for a client if the physician determines that an individual client requires 24-hour licensed nursing care. This plan shall be integrated in the individual program plan.

(3) The facility shall provide or obtain preventive and general medical care as well as annual physical examinations of each client that at a minimum include the following:

1. Evaluation of vision and hearing.

2. Immunizations, using as a guide the recommendations of the Public Health Service Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices or of the Committee on the Control of Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

3. Routine screening laboratory examinations as determined necessary by the physician, and special studies when needed.

4. Tuberculosis control, appropriate to the facility's population, and in accordance with the recommendations of the American College of Chest Physicians or the section of diseases of the chest of the American Academy of Pediatrics, or both.

441 IAC 109.9(1) (Department of Humans Services): Child Care Centers:

441—109.9 (237A) Records.

109.9(1) Personnel records. The center shall maintain personnel information sufficient to ensure that persons employed in the center meet minimum staff and training requirements and do not pose any threat to the health, safety, or well-being of the children. Each employee's file shall contain, at a minimum, the following:

a. A statement signed by each individual indicating whether or not the individual has any conviction of violating any law in any state or has any record of founded child abuse or dependent adult abuse in any state.

b. Copies of all records checks kept in accordance with state and federal law regarding confidentiality of records checks. These records shall include:

(1) A copy of Form 595-1396, DHS Criminal History Record Check Form B, or any other permission form approved by the department of public safety for conducting an Iowa or national criminal history record check.

(2) A copy of Form 470-0643, Request for Child Abuse Information, when applicable.

(3) Copies of the results of Iowa records checks conducted through the SING for review by the department upon request.

(4) Copies of national criminal history check results.

(5) Any department-issued documents sent to the center related to a records check, regardless of findings.

c. Reserved.

d. A physical examination report. Personnel shall have good health as evidenced by a preemployment examination, including testing for communicable diseases which shall include testing for tuberculosis, performed within six months prior to beginning employment by a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, physician's assistant or advanced registered nurse practitioner and repeated at least every three years after initial employment.

481 IAC 51.24 (Department of Inspections and Appeals): Hospitals

51.24(3) Health examinations. Health examinations for all personnel shall be required at the commencement of employment and thereafter at least every four years. The examination shall include, at a minimum, the health and tuberculosis status of the employee. Consideration shall be given to requiring health examinations at shorter intervals for those employees working in high-risk areas.

- a. Employees shall have a physical examination and tuberculin test before employment. At least every four years after beginning employment, employees shall have a physical examination and assessment of tuberculin status. (III)

641 IAC 150.6 (Department of Public Health) Level I Hospitals

150.6(8) *Infection control.*

- a. Each hospital establishes written policies and procedures for assessing the health of personnel assigned to the perinatal care services and those who have significant contact with the newborn. This includes restricting their contact with patients when necessary. These policies and procedures include screening for tuberculosis and rubella. Routine culturing of specimens obtained from personnel is not useful, although selective culturing may be of value when a pattern of infection is suspected.

641 IAC 155.21 (Department of Public Health) Substance Abuse Treatment Programs

155.21(4) Staff development and training. There shall be written policies and procedures that establish staff development. Staff development shall include orientation for staff and opportunities for continuing job-related education. For corporations organized under Iowa Code chapter 496C and sole practitioners, documentation of continuing education to maintain professional license or certification as specified in 155.21(8) will meet the requirements of this subrule.

a. Evidence of professional education, certification as specified in 155.21(8), licensing, or orientation which includes the following: psychosocial, medical, pharmacological, confidentiality, and tuberculosis and blood-borne pathogens; an orientation to the program and community resources; counseling skill development; HIV/AIDS (human immunodeficiency virus/acquired immune deficiency syndrome) information/education; and the attitudes, values and lifestyles of racially diverse cultures, other cultures and special populations.

Halfway house services (Level III.1) within 21 calendar days of admission.

b. For individuals who enter a Level I or Level II service, a medical history shall be obtained upon admission.

c. A program may accept medical history and physical examination results from referral sources if the medical history and examination were completed no more than 90 days prior to admission.

d. All client/patients admitted to residential, inpatient or halfway house services and high-risk outpatient client/patients shall have a tuberculosis skin test administered and read within 5 days of admission. If the client/patient has documentation of negative tuberculosis skin test within the previous 90 days, the tuberculosis test may be accepted if the client/patient does not show any symptoms. If the client/patient has unexplained symptoms or a history of positive tuberculosis skin tests, the physician shall determine what tests are needed.

Each resident admitted shall have had a physical examination prior to admission and annually thereafter. If the resident is admitted directly from a hospital, a copy of the hospital admission physical and discharge summary may be part of the record in lieu of an additional physical examination. (II, III)

The record of the admission physical examination shall portray the current medical status of the resident and shall include the resident's name, sex, age, medical history, tuberculosis status, diagnosis, statement of chief complaints, and results of any diagnostic procedure. (II, III)

Each resident admitted shall have a physical examination and tuberculin test no more than 30 days before admission and a physical examination annually after that. Each annual examination shall be sufficient to ensure the resident has no physical condition which precludes living in the facility. If the resident is admitted directly from a hospital, a copy of the hospital admission physical and discharge summary may meet this requirement. (II, III)

Screening may be done by a screening center or other qualified providers. Other qualified providers are physicians, advanced registered nurse practitioners, rural health centers, federally qualified health centers, clinics, and dentists. Screening services shall include all of the following services:

84.3(6) Appropriate laboratory tests. These shall include:

d. Tuberculin test when appropriate.

g. The program physician or designee, who is a qualified medical professional, shall complete a medical evaluation and a current psychological/mental status evaluation of the client/patient prior to the administration of the initial dose of medication. If the history and current psychological/mental status evaluation is completed by an individual other than the program physician, the program shall document in the client/patient's case record that this information was reviewed by the program physician prior to the initial dosage of medication. The medical evaluation shall include but not be limited to:

(4)Laboratory tests including: Intradermal PPD (tuberculosis skin test) and review of tetanus immunization status;
