The Iowa Board of Barbering (hereinafter, "Board") files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.12(2), 17A.18(3) and 158.12 (2011), and 645 Iowa Administrative Code ("IAC") §§ 11.6, 13.1 and 25.2. Andrew Harris ("Respondent") was issued Iowa license #014907 on May 18, 2010. Respondent's license is current and will next expire on June 30, 2012. Respondent's address as reported to the Board is 1709 Carpenter, Des Moines, Iowa 50314.

A. TIME, PLACE AND NATURE OF HEARING

Hearing. A disciplinary contested case hearing will be held on **January 24, 2012**, before the Board of Barbering. The hearing will begin at **3:30 p.m.** and be located in the Lucas State Office Building, Fifth Floor Board Conference Room 526, Des Moines, Iowa.

Answer. Within twenty (20) days of the date you are served this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges you are required by 645 IAC § 11.12 to file an Answer. The Answer should specifically admit, deny, or otherwise answer all allegations contained in sections C and D of this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Pleadings shall be filed with the Board at the following address: Iowa Board of

Barbering, 5th Floor, Lucas State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa, 50319.

Presiding Officer. The Board shall serve as presiding officer, but the Board may request an Administrative Law Judge make initial rulings on pre-hearing matters, and be present to assist and advise the board at the hearing.

Hearing Procedures. The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at 641 IAC § chapter 11. At the hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by legal counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at the hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for the hearing, you must comply with the requirements of 645 IAC § 11.18. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at your discretion.

Pre-hearing Conference. Any party may request a pre-hearing conference to discuss evidentiary issues related to the hearing. The Board's rules regarding pre-hearing conferences are contained at 645 IAC § 11.17.

Prosecution. The Office of the Iowa Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State of Iowa) in this proceeding. Copies of pleadings should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address: David Van Compernelle, Assistant Attorney General, Iowa Attorney General's Office, 2nd Floor, Hoover State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319.

Communications. You may not contact board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, or e-mail, about this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have

notice and an opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board office and serve upon all parties in the case.

B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

Jurisdiction. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 147, 158, and 272C (2011).

Legal Authority. If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code Chapters 17A, 147, 158, and 272C (2011), and 645 IAC chapter 25.

Default. If you fail to appear at the hearing, the Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code § 17A.12(3) (2011) and 645 IAC § 11.21.

C. CHARGE

Count I

Respondent is charged under Iowa Code §§ 158.12, 272C.3(2)(a) (2011) and 645 IAC § 25.2(20) with failure to comply with the terms of a board order.

D. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

On May 17, 2010, the Board issued a prior order in this case. The Consent Agreement and Order provided that Respondent would notify the Board, in writing, of his employment in the State of Iowa. His reports were to be filed quarterly. Respondent was also required to have his probation officer provide quarterly reports that

Respondent's conditions of probation were being met. Respondent has failed to submit quarterly reports. Quarterly reports have not been received from Respondent's probation officer.

E. SETTLEMENT

This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. Procedural rules governing the Board's settlement process are found at 645 IAC chapter 12. If you are interested in pursuing settlement of this matter, please contact David Van Compernelle, Assistant Attorney General, at 515/281-7262.

F. PROBABLE CAUSE FINDING
