COME NOW Donnis Crank (Respondent) and the Iowa Board of Podiatry (Board) and enter into the following Stipulated Order:

1. This matter was initiated pursuant to a Statement of Charges filed by the Board on February 10, 2011. A contested case hearing was held on March 14, 2011. On April 5, 2011, the Board issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Decision and Order (Decision and Order).
3. The March 14, 2011 Decision and Order in this matter placed Respondent's podiatry license on an indefinite period of probation.
4. Under the Decision and Order, during the period of probation, Respondent's license was made subject to a Practice Monitoring Plan and an Educational Intervention (as described more fully in Paragraph's 1 and 2 on pages 12 and 13 of the Decision and Order).
5. Under Paragraph 3 of the Decision and Order, the probationary period does not end until the Board "determines that [Respondent] has obtained maximum benefits from the Practice Monitoring Plan and from the Educational Intervention."
6. Respondent has retired from active practice.

7. The parties agree that the probationary terms contained in paragraphs 1 and 2 on pages 12 and 13 of the Decision and Order shall be indefinitely suspended until such time as Respondent resumes practice as a podiatrist in Iowa. Respondent understands that all of the terms of the Decision and Order shall immediately become effective upon his commencement of work (volunteer or paid) as a podiatrist. Upon resumption of work (volunteer or paid) as a podiatrist, the probationary terms established by the Decision and Order shall resume.

8. Respondent shall notify the Board that he is resuming work as a podiatrist prior to resumption of such work. Upon commencement of podiatry work, the terms of the Decision and Order shall immediately and automatically come back fully into effect.

9. This Stipulated Order is a public record.

10. This Stipulated Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent and the State to the Board for its consideration.

11. This Stipulated Order must be approved by the Board. If the Board fails to approve this Stipulated Order it shall be of no force or effect to either party.
