Comes now the Iowa Board of Podiatry (Board), on this 13th day of October, 2011, and finds it was presented with evidence which establishes that the grounds justifying the Board's September 30th Emergency Adjudicative Order (Emergency Order) in this matter have ceased to exist.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. An Emergency Order was issued against Respondent on the grounds that Respondent failed to maintain a safe and sanitary treatment environment, and that Respondent failed to respond to a Board-issued Order for Evaluation.
 - 2. Respondent has now completed the Board-ordered Evaluation.
- 3. Respondent has presented credible evidence that the defects in his treatment environment have been remedied.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. Emergency adjudicative proceedings are available to the Board pursuant to Iowa Code section 17A.18A in situations involving immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare. Such proceedings result in the issuance of Emergency Orders addressing the underlying emergency.
- 5. The emergency underlying the Emergency Order in this case has ceased. It does not appear that there is a current immediate danger to the public. It is therefore appropriate to rescind the Emergency Order.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the Emergency Adjudicative Order issued in this matter on September 30, 2011 is RESCINDED.
