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On September 7, 2007, the Iowa Board of Dietetics (Board) approved a Settlement Agreement and Final Order (Settlement Agreement) in the above-captioned matter. Paragraph 12 of the Settlement Agreement states as follows:

**12. Restriction against Providing Individual Assessments.** Respondent shall be restricted from providing individual assessments of clients in her practice of dietetics unless and until she submits a request to the Board to remove this restriction, in which case the Board shall consider the request and if granted, will prescribe specific continuing education and practice monitoring conditions as a requirement for removal of the restriction.

On June 10, 2013, Board received a request from Respondent to remove the restriction against performing individual assessments. After consideration, the Board agrees to remove the restriction subject to certain conditions.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that paragraph 12 of the Settlement Agreement and Final Order approved by the Board on September 7, 2007, is amended to read as follows:

**“12. Restriction on providing individual assessments.** Respondent may provide individual assessment of clients in her practice of dietetics subject to the following restrictions:

- a. Respondent shall not begin to provide individual assessments until such time as she has completed fifteen (15) hours of continuing

education. Such hours shall be directly related to the subject areas of nutrition assessment or nutrition care processes. All continuing education hours must be clinically based and be submitted to the Board for approval to satisfy this requirement. Continuing education obtained in fulfillment of this requirement shall not count toward the continuing education normally required for renewal of Respondent's license.

- b. Respondent shall not begin to provide individual assessments until she obtains a Board-approved practice monitor. The practice monitor must be a registered dietitian. Once the practice monitor is approved by the Board, Respondent may provide individual assessments so long as she continues to meet with the practice monitor at least one (1) time per month for consultation and a review of at least 80% of all charts and documentation associated with individual assessments performed since the last monthly meeting. The practice monitor must submit quarterly reports to the Board. Such reports shall be due on September 1, 2013, and every three months thereafter. Any changes in the practice monitor must be submitted to and approved by the Board. Respondent is required to maintain a practice monitor indefinitely, until Respondent submits a request to the Board to remove this restriction and the Board approves the request. Respondent must work with a practice monitor for a minimum of one (1) year before

she is allowed to submit a request to the Board for the removal of  
this restriction.”

This Stipulated Order is approved by the Board July 24, 2013.
