

Code. The Applicant paid a \$ 500 fine, and served 60 days in county jail for one of the charges; for the other charge, a deferred sentence was imposed, with a mandatory sentence of three years of probation. The Applicant was discharged from probation in August 2004 upon successful completion of all terms of her probation, and has had no other criminal convictions since 2001.

3. The Applicant has satisfied all other requirements for the issuance of a temporary permit.
4. Upon approval of this Agreement by the Board, the Applicant shall receive a restricted temporary permit subject to the conditions specified in this Agreement.
5. The Applicant shall notify her current employer of this Agreement, and shall provide a copy of this Agreement to her employer and the licensed dispenser who will provide supervision for the duration of the Applicant's period of supervised practice.
6. The Applicant shall comply with all Iowa Code and administrative rules requirements for temporary permit holders and supervision of persons who hold a temporary permit.
7. In the event the Applicant satisfies the board's requirements for the issuance of a license, the Applicant shall be issued a probationary license for a period of five years, commencing with the date of license issuance.
8. Following issuance of a probationary license, the Applicant shall report to the board in writing on a quarterly basis to verify the Applicant's compliance with all terms of this agreement. The Applicant shall be informed by the board of the required reporting dates.

9. The Applicant shall notify any future employers or prospective employers of this Agreement, and shall provide a copy of this Agreement to any employer or prospective employer for whom the Applicant provides services of a licensed hearing aid dispenser.
10. For the duration of the probationary license, the Applicant shall notify the board of any changes of employment, including any new employers or to pursue independent practice as a licensed hearing aid dispenser.
11. The board will consider any future employment information provided by the Applicant, to determine whether additional practice restrictions shall be imposed as a condition of licensure. Those restrictions may include, but are not limited to, notification to vendors, and bonding or audited trust accounts for all client payments.
12. The Applicant shall comply with all provisions of law and the board's administrative rules.
13. The board reserves the right to review and amend the terms of this Consent Agreement during the Applicant's period of probation, and may specify that the Applicant submit records for review and/or meet with the Board at any time during the period her license is on probationary status.
14. Should the Applicant violate the terms of this Consent Agreement in any respect, the Board may institute formal disciplinary proceedings. This Agreement shall be made part of the permanent record of the Board, and violations of this Agreement

may be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any future disciplinary action.

15. This Agreement is subject to approval by the Board. If the Board fails to approve this Agreement, it shall be of no force or effect on either party.

16. The Applicant voluntarily submits this Agreement to the Board for its consideration.

17. This Agreement is a public record available for inspection and copying in accordance with Iowa law. **Wherefore**, the terms of this Consent Agreement are agreed to and accepted by the Iowa Board of Examiners for the Licensing and Regulation of Hearing Aid Dispensers and the Applicant.

This Consent Agreement and Order is approved by the board on July 12, 2005.
