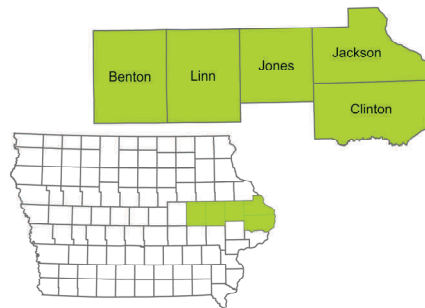

Population counts are based on 2012 population estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau. Adult prevalence estimates are self-reported rates of smoking in Iowans 18 and older; youth rates are self-reported tobacco use rates in 11th grade students.

Rates where number of events is less than 20. *At least 5% of all county inpatient records are missing. *Less than half of 11th grade students in this county participated in the survey. Rates that are asterisked should be interpreted with caution and not compared with other counties. na=number students participating too low to reliably report rates. Deaths are 2008-2010 and hospitalizations are 2006-2008 vintage. Average per capita state funding across all community partnerships was \$0.71 in FY2014.
