Policy

From the WIC Services Policy and Procedure Manual – 380.80 Training Breastfeeding Peer Counselors

The training curriculum for WIC breastfeeding peer counselors is "Loving Support through Peer Counseling." The curriculum includes many opportunities for discussion and interaction between the peer counselors. The activities are critical components of the training.

The state WIC agency's responsibilities in training include:

- Training the local agency breastfeeding peer counselor coordinator,
- Training of other agency staff along with the peer counselor coordinator is recommended but not required,
- Providing copies of the training curriculum,
- Providing training props and equipment, and
- Provide breastfeeding resources (videos, DVDs, books, brochures).

The local WIC agency's responsibilities in training include:

- Making local arrangements for all training events (including site logistics, refreshments, etc),
- Training the peer counselors, and
- Using the "peer counselor skills checklist" throughout training to assure that peer counselors have demonstrated understanding of all curriculum modules.

The campaign will also be supported by many partners including the Partnership for Food Safety Education, food retailers, consumer groups and academia, as well as state and local agriculture and public health agencies.

By promoting Food Safe Families, you can become part of a nationwide effort to reduce the number of cases of foodborne illness—a serious but often unrecognized public health issue that equates to one in six Americans getting sick every year.

Program Expands Effort to Build Maternal and Child Health Infrastructure and Capacity in Health Plans

The National Institute for Health Care Management (NIHCM) Foundation has launched a new Promising Practices in Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Program to recognize emerging and promising programs or policies in MCH, promote program replication and new collaborations, and create a dedicated space where health plans and other MCH leaders can share their success stories with peers. Through the new project, NIHCM has joined eight other national professional organizations, including the Academy of Pediatrics, the American Bar Association, the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials, Family Voices, Grantmakers in Health, the National Association of County and City Health Officials, the National Conference of State Legislatures, and the National Governors Association, in helping members make well-informed decisions on matters impacting the health and health care of mothers and children. On a quarterly basis, one promising practices submission will be selected and highlighted in a fact sheet designed and produced by NIHCM.
