COMES NOW the Iowa Board of Social Work (Board) and files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.12(2), 17A.18(3), and 645 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) 11.6. Respondent was issued Iowa license 304 03080 on March 2, 1998. Respondent's license to practice master's level social work in Iowa is current and will next expire on December 31, 2010.

Respondent's address as reported to the Board is 208 Fletcher, Sidney, Iowa 51652.

A. TIME, PLACE AND NATURE OF HEARING

Hearing. A disciplinary contested case hearing shall be held on July 20, 2009, before the Board of Social Work. The hearing shall begin at 1:00 p.m. and shall be located in the Lucas State Office Building, Fifth Floor Board Conference Room 526, Des Moines, Iowa.

Answer. Within twenty (20) days of the date you are served this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges you are required by 645 IAC 11.12 to file an Answer. The Answer should specifically admit, deny, or otherwise answer all allegations contained in sections C and D of this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Pleadings shall be filed with the Board at the following address: Iowa Board of Social Work, Lucas State Office Building—5th Floor, 321 E. 12th St., Des Moines, Iowa, 50319.

Presiding Officer. The Board shall serve as presiding officer, but the Board may request an Administrative Law Judge make initial rulings on pre-hearing matters, and be present to assist and advise the board at hearing.

Hearing Procedures. The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at 641 IAC chapter 11. At hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by legal counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for hearing, you must comply with the requirements of 645 IAC 11.18. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at your discretion.

Pre-hearing Conference. Any party may request a pre-hearing conference to discuss evidentiary issues related to the hearing. The Board's rules regarding pre-hearing conferences are contained at 645 IAC 11.17.

Prosecution. The Office of the Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State) in this proceeding. Copies of pleadings should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address: Heather Adams, Assistant Attorney General, Iowa Attorney General's Office, 2nd Floor, Hoover State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319.

Communications. You may not contact board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, or e-mail, about this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have

notice and an opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board office and serve upon all parties in the case.

B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

Jurisdiction. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 147, Chapter 154C, and 272C.

Legal Authority. If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code Chapters 17A, 147, 154C, and 272C and 645 IAC Chapter 283.

Default. If you fail to appear at the hearing, the Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code Section 17A.12(3) and 645 IAC 11.21.

C. SECTIONS OF STATUTES AND RULES INVOLVED

Count I

Pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code 645—282.2(5)a, Respondent is charged with failure to maintain sufficient, timely and accurate documentation in client records.

Count II

Pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code 645—282.2(7)a, Respondent is charged with billing for services that were not provided.

Count III

Pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code 645—282.2(7)f(1), Respondent is charged with failure to establish and maintain billing practices that accurately reflect the nature and extent of services provided.

Count IV

Pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code 645—283.2(3), Respondent is charged with knowingly making misleading, deceptive, untrue and fraudulent representations in the practice of social work and engaging in unethical conduct or practice harmful or detrimental to the public.

Count V

Pursuant to 645 Iowa Administrative Code 645—282.2(2), Respondent is charged with representing himself as an M.D. and a PhD. when he holds neither degree.

Count VI

Pursuant to 645 Iowa Administrative Code 645—282.2(6), Respondent is charge with failing to provide a client with access to the client's records.

Count VII

Pursuant to Iowa Administrative Code 645—283.2(12), Respondent is charged with violation of a regulation, rule, or law of this state which relates to the practice of social work, including, but not limited to, the rules of conduct found in 645—282.

D. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

1. Respondent submitted billing sheets and signed progress notes for services allegedly provided to Client #1 on two occasions after Client #1's death.
2. Respondent does not have hospital privileges.
3. Respondent submitted a billing sheet and signed a progress note for Client #2 on a date when Client #2 was hospitalized and was not seen by Respondent.

4. Respondent submitted a billing sheet and signed a progress note for Client #3 on a date when Client #3 was hospitalized and was not seen by Respondent.

5. Respondent submitted a billing sheet and signed a progress note for Client #4 on a date when Client #4 was hospitalized and was not seen by Respondent.

6. Respondent submitted a progress note for Client #5 on a date when Client #5 was hospitalized and was not seen by Respondent.

7. Respondent submitted a billing sheet for Client #6 on a date when Client #6 was hospitalized and was not seen by Respondent.

8. Respondent submitted progress notes for Client #7 for three dates when Client #7 was not seen by Respondent.

9. Respondent submitted a billing sheet for Client #8 for an evaluation that was completed on February 28, 2007. However, the evaluation was not completed on February 28, 2007. Client #8 is a male, however, Respondent identified Client #8 as a female on the billing sheet.

10. Client #9 completed a chemical dependency evaluation with Respondent on January 23, 2007, and paid for the evaluation. Client #9 reported on March 6, 2007, that he had not received a copy of this chemical dependent evaluation completed by the Respondent. Another counselor completed another evaluation at no charge for Client #9 so that Client #9 could begin chemical dependency classes.

11. Respondent identified himself to Client #9 as an M.D. in the process of being licensed. Respondent signs his progress notes "Ph.D. Cand." Respondent is neither an M.D. or a Ph.D.

E. SETTLEMENT

This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. The procedural rules governing the Board's settlement process are found at 645 IAC chapter 12. If you are interested in pursuing settlement of this matter, please contact Heather Adams, Assistant Attorney General, at 515/281-3441.

F. PROBABLE CAUSE FINDING

On May 28, 2009, the Iowa Board of Social Work found probable cause to file this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges.
