COMES NOW the Iowa Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board (Board) and hereby files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.12(2), 17A.18(3), and 641 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) 33.6. Respondent holds Iowa Journeyperson Plumbing license number 07753. Respondent's license is active and will expire on September 4, 2014.

A. TIME, PLACE AND NATURE OF HEARING

Hearing. A disciplinary contested case hearing shall be held on **July 15, 2014,** before the Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board. The hearing shall begin at **1:45 p.m.**, and shall be located in State Hygienic Lab, 2220 S. Ankeny Blvd., Ankeny, Iowa, Iowa Lab Facility rooms 207 and 208.

Answer. Within twenty (20) days of the date you are served this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges you are required by 641 IAC 33.13 to file an Answer. The Answer should specifically admit, deny, or otherwise answer all allegations contained in sections C and D of this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Pleadings shall be filed with the Board at the following address: Iowa Plumbing and Mechanical Systems Board, Lucas State Office Building, 321 East 12th Street, Des Moines, Iowa, 50319.

<u>Presiding Officer</u>. The Board shall serve as presiding officer, but the Board may request an Administrative Law Judge make initial rulings on pre-hearing matters, and be present to assist and advise the board at hearing.

Hearing Procedures. The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at

641 IAC chapter 33. At hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by legal counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for hearing, you must comply with the requirements of 641 IAC 33.22. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at your discretion.

<u>Pre-hearing Conference</u>. Any party may request a pre-hearing conference to discuss evidentiary issues related to the hearing. The Board's rules regarding pre-hearing conferences are contained at 641 IAC 33.21.

<u>Prosecution</u>. The Office of the Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State) in this proceeding. Copies of pleadings should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address: September Lau, Assistant Attorney General, Iowa Attorney General's Office, 2nd Floor, Hoover State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319.

Communications. You may not contact board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, or e-mail, about this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have notice and an opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board office and serve upon all parties in the case.

B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

<u>Jurisdiction</u>. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code chapters 105 and 272C.

<u>Legal Authority</u>. If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code chapters 17A, 105, and 272C and 641 IAC

<u>Default</u>. If you fail to appear at the hearing, the Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code section 17A.12(3) and 641 IAC 33.26.

C. SECTIONS OF STATUTES AND RULES INVOLVED

Count I

Respondent is charged pursuant to Iowa Code section 105.22(10) and 641 IAC 32.2(18) with violation of a law, ordinance, or regulation of this State in that Respondent violated Iowa Code section 105.10(1) and (2).

D. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

- 1. Respondent owns and operates General Plumbing in Fort Madison, Iowa, as a sole proprietorship.
- 2. On September 4, 2009, Respondent applied for and obtained Journeyperson Plumbing licensure from the Board. Respondent holds no other licensure. Respondent has kept his plumbing license up-to-date, and it is set to expire on September 4, 2014.
 - 3. Respondent d/b/a General Plumbing does not employ a master in any trade.
- 4. Respondent d/b/a General Plumbing has engaged in the business of providing 105-covered plumbing work since State licensing went into effect without the supervision of a licensed master in violation of Iowa Code section 105.10(2).
- 5. Neither Respondent nor General Plumbing has obtained contractor licensure in the state of Iowa in violation of Iowa Code section 105.10(1).

E. SETTLEMENT

This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. The procedural rules governing the
